Reconciliation Statement

NGPS recognizes the historical significance and contributions of Indigenous Peoples and their cultures and understands the important role that the Indigenous community plays today and in the future. Acting on a recommendation from the Community Engagement Committee, the Board has begun sharing a Reconciliation Statement at the beginning of meetings that describes specific actions taken by the Division in response to the Education Calls to Action articulated by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

D-Day 80: Juno and the Road to Liberation

Several Hilltop Jr/Sr High School students had the opportunity to join lead teacher Pam Mehl for an incredible learning experience overseas this past November as part of the educational D-Day 80: Juno and the Road to Liberation tour.

Mikayla and Abigail, two of the students on the trip, shared their unique experiences with the Board, from visiting Anne Franks's house in Amsterdam and imagining what a day in her confined life would be like, to walking through reconstructions of battle trenches in Vimy.

Students were extremely moved by the experience and eager to share their learning which also took them through Amsterdam's famous canals, to the Louvre for art and history, to Versailles where the Treaty of Versaille was signed, and on a Seine River cruise.

Presentation: Draft Administrative Procedure (AP) 652, Responsible Use of Artifical Intelligence (AI) to Support Instruction

Katrina Zack, teacher at Hilltop Jr/Sr High School and President of the local ATA, and NGPS Superintendent Kevin Bird, introduced DRAFT Administrative Procedure 652 for the Board's reference. Zack, Bird, and Zack's provincial ATA contact drafted the AP after determining that there currently exists no Administrative Procedure in Alberta school divisions that guides educators on the use of AI to support instruction.

Zack explained how AI needs to be viewed as an entity – one that is constantly growing and changing. The Draft AP provides direction for teachers as to how AI can be incorporated into teaching, learning and preparation, and how it cannot replace teacher involvement in student learning.

Draft 2023-24 Annual Education Results Report (AERR)

NGPS Director of Learning Tammy Davis presented the Division's draft 2023-24 Annual Education Results Report highlighting student enrollment numbers, and Alberta survey results in the areas of student growth and achievement, teaching and leading, learning supports, and governance.

Bylaws will be presented at the next meeting of the Board for Second and Third and Final Readings.
